Notice is hereby given that J. B. Wilson of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of fir cordwood and a lot of hewed fir rail-road ties, being about 450 cords of fir wood and 900 fir rail-road ties in quantity, which was cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, are marked thus, no mark, and 150 cords of said wood are now lying in the South east quarter of the South east quarter of Section twenty-four, Township three North, Range seven East of the Willamette Meridian, 150 cords of said cordwood are now lying in Lots five and eight in Section twenty-five, Township three North, Range seven and a half East of the Willamette Meridian, and also about 150 cords of said cordwood are now lying on or near the wharf on the Columbia River in Lot thirteen in Section two - six, Township three North, Range seven and a half East of the Willamette Meridian. All of the above being in Skamania County, Washington. And said hewed fir railroad ties are now lying in Lots 5 and 8 in Section 25, Township 3. N. R. 7 1/2 E. N. W. in Skamania County, Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in manufacturing and fluming said cordwood and schooling the railroad ties down the hill; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is J. D. Crawford; that J. D. Crawford employed said J. B. Wilson to perform such labor and render such assistance on the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

That said J. D. Crawford agreed to pay the said J. B. Wilson for such labor and assistance 50 cts per cord for sawing said wood and 50 cts for splitting said wood, and \$2.00 per day for schooling said Railroad ties and \$2.00 per day for fluming said wood, that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said J. B. Wilson, who performed labor upon and assistance in manufacturing and fluming said cordwood and in schooling said Railroad ties, that said J. B. Wilson sawed 7 cords of wood and split 53 1/4 cords of wood and performed service in fluming said cordwood and schooling said railroad ties, for the period of 26 1/4 days; that all of said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered on said cordwood and Railroad ties between the 14th day of April, 1900, and the 20th day of June, 1900; and the rendition of said service was closed on the 20th day of June, 1900, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$82.62 dollars; that no part thereof has been paid except \$3.50, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all first credits and offsets, the sum

of \$49.12, in which amount he claims a lien upon the said Cordwood and ties. The said J. B. Wilson also claims a lien on said cordwood and Railroad ties now owned by said J. D. Crawford of said County and State to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said Cordwood and Railroad ties herein described.
