

Notice of Location.

To Whom it May Concern:

Notice is hereby given, That Charles W. Bigham, a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Twenty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 4th day of October A.D., 1896, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz Claim, known as the "Kingbird" lode or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 4th day of October 1896, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on the lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the centre thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes, the top or where of which lie within said boundaries) (twenty acres of mining ground), situated in Copper Creek District, County of Skamania, State of Washington, particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This claim lays 1500 feet E. by 20 degrees N. This is an extension on the claim known as Jennie's Cramp and runs 300 feet each way from the center. The notice is on one fifth at the end of said claim, Jennie's Cramp.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
