

Notice of Location of Mountain Lode by Freeman P. Peniston
 Notice of Location

To Whom it may Concern

Notice is hereby Given, That I Freeman P. Peniston a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statute of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the Twentieth day of Oct-1896, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz Lode, known as the Mountain Lode or Mining Lode, said lode having been discovered the twentieth day of Oct-1896, and do claim (Fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dip, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) (Twenty acres of placer mining ground) situated in Copper Creek Dist. County of Skamania State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This claim is situated on Copper Creek about two miles above the claim known as the Big Bluff and opposite the first right hand creek that empties into Copper Creek. This claim runs 1500 ft. at about 10 degrees East of South and 200 ft. each way from this notice and I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
