Notice is hereby given that J. C. Snyder of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon all the real and personal property of Rudolph Kraft, which is used in the operation of the said Rudolph Kraft's logging business in Skamania County, State of Washington, to the extent of the monies due the claimant herein for work and assistance rendered for said Rudolph Kraft upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: That J. C. Snyder was employed by Frank Kraft, who was at the time of said employment the agent and manager of said Rudolph Kraft in the operation of ^{his} said logging business in Skamania County, State of Washington; That the name of the owner or reputed owner of the hereinafter described property is Rudolph Kraft; That said Frank Kraft, agent and manager for said Rudolph Kraft agreed to pay the said J. C. Snyder, for such labor and assistance \$2.00 per day; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said J. C. Snyder, who performed labor upon ~~said~~ and assisted in operating said logging business in falling and bucking and building road for the period of $27\frac{1}{2}$ days; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered between the 23^d day of July 1901, and the 21st day of November, 1901, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 21st day of November, 1901, and ninety days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$54.90; that no part thereof has been paid except \$42.65, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and effects, the sum of \$12.25, in which amount claimant claims a lien upon the following described property situated in Skamania County, State of Washington; a certain skid road commencing at or near the Nelson Creek saw mill on the N. 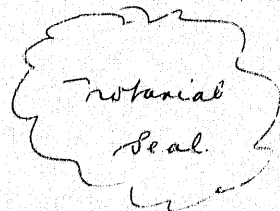
