TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, BY THE ACT OF CONGRESS APPROVED JULY 2, 1864 (13 STAT., 365), ENTITLED "AN ACT GRANTING LANDS TO AID IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF A RAILROAD AND TELE-GRAPH LINE FROM LAKE SUPERIOR TO PUGET'S SOUND, ON THE PACIFIC COAST, BY THE NORTHERN ROUTE," AND THE JOINT RESOLUTION OF MAY 31, 1870 (16 STAT., 378), THERE WAS GRANTED TO THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AIDING IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF SAID RAILROAD AND TELEGRAPH LINE, AND BRANCH, TO THE PACIFIC COAST, "EVERY ALTERNATE SECTION OF PUBLIC LAND, NOT MINERAL, DESIGNATED BY ODD NUMBERS, TO THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY ALTERNATE SECTIONS PER MICE, ON EACH SIDE OF SAID RAILROAD LINE, AS SAID COMPANY MAY ADOPT, THROUGH THE TERRITORIES OF THE UNITED STATES, AND TEN ALTERNATE SECTIONS OF LAND PER MILE ON EACH SIDE OF SAID RAILROAD WHENEVER IT PASSES THROUGH ANY STATE, AND WHENEVER ON THE LINE THEREOF, THE UNITED STATES HAVE FULL TITLE, NOT RESERVED, SOLD, GRANTED, OR OTHERWISE APPRO-PRIATED, AND FREE FROM PREEMPTION, OR OTHER CLAIMS OR RIGHTS, AT THE TIME THE LINE OF SAID ROAD IS DEFINITELY FIXED, AND A PLATT THEREOF FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE; "PROVIDED, FURTHER, "THAT ALL MINERAL LANDS BE, AND THE SAME ARE HEREBY, EXCLUDED FROM THE OPERATIONS OF THIS ACT," AND PROVIDED, FURTHER, "THAT THE WORD 'MINERAL,' WHEN IT OCCURS IN THIS ACT, SHALL NOT BE HELD TO INCLUDE IRON OR COAL; "AND

WHEREAS, OFFICIAL STATEMENTS FROM THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, HAVE BEEN FILED IN THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE, SHOWING THAT THE COMMISSIONERS APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT, UNDER THE RPOVISIONS OF THE FOURTH SECTION OF THE FIRST-NAMED ACT, HAVE REPORTED TO HIM THAT THE SAID NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD AND TELEGRAPH LINE, AND BRANCH, EXCEPTING THAT PORTION BETWEEN WALLULA, WASHINGTON, AND PORTLAND, OREGON. DECLARED FORFEITED BY THE ACT OF SEPTEMBER 29, 1890, HAVE BEEN CONSTRUCTED AND FULLY COMPLETED AND EQUIPED IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE ACT RELATIVE THERETO, AND THE SAME ACCEPTED BY THE PRESIDENT; AND

WHEREAS, THERE HAS BEEN FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF THE INTER-IOR EVIDENCE SHOWING THAT THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY IS THE LAWFUL SUCCESS-OR IN INTEREST TO THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RATLROAD COMPANY AS TO ALL LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE GRANT MADE TO THE SAID NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY BY THE ACT OF JULY 2, 1864, AND ALL SUBSEQUENT LEGISLATION; AND
