Notice is hereby given that E. Burkhardt of Skamania county, state of Washington, claims a lien upon all the real and personal property of Rudolph Kraft, which is used in the operation of the said Rudolph Kraft's logging business in Skamania county, state of Washington, to the extent of the monies due the claimant herein for work and assistance rendered for said Rudolph Kraft upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: That E. Burkhardt was employed by Geo. Buttrick, who was at the time of said employment the agent and manager of said Rudolph Kraft in the operation of his said logging business in Skamania county, state of Washington; That the name of the owner or reputed owner of the herein after described property is Rudolph Kraft; That said Geo. Buttrick, agent and manager for said Rudolph Kraft, agreed to pay the said E. Burkhardt, for such labor and assistance \$2.50 per day; That said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said E. Burkhardt, who performed labor upon and assisted in operating said logging business as skid road builder for the period of 123 days; That said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered between the 27<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1901, and the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1901, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1901, and ninety days have not elapsed since that time; That the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$307.50; That no part thereof has been paid except \$281, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$26.50, in which amount claimant claims a lien upon the following described property situated in Skamania county, state of Washington: a certain skid road commencing at or near the Nelson Creek saw mill on the N.W. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 25 Twp. 3 N. R. 7 1/2 E. T. 7 N. running through Lot 9, Sec. 25 Twp. 3 N. R. 7 1/2 E. T. 7 N. running thence through S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 25 Twp. 3 N. R. 7 E. T. 7 N. one donkey engine, Sawyer's manufacture, 7 x 8 cylinders; one Sagerwood logging donkey engine 7 x 10 cylinders, 600 feet of 1/4 inch cable; 1900 feet of 1/2 inch trip line; two pair logging grabs, A. Turquest make; four pair donkey dogs; two trip line blocks, A. Turquest make; one head block, A. Turquest make;

one lead block, A. Burquest make, one yarding block, A. Burquest make; one yarder with hook and eye, 125 feet long; one yarder without hook and eye, 125 feet long; one yarder, with hook and eye 50 feet long; Eight chopping axes with handles; two falling axes with handles; four sledges with handles; eight wedges, falling and bucking mixed; three Atkins cross cut saws; 6 1/2 feet long; one Simmons Webfoot falling saw 7 feet 8 inches; two claw hammers, one machine hammer; 1 monkey wrench; 1 pipe wrench; 1 Marlin spike; 1 file cleaner; 3 coal chisels; 3 steel punches; 2 block loops; 2 block straps; 500 feet signal line; 5 saw handles; 2 shovels; 3 picks; 2 grubbing hoes; 1 scale pole; 6 p peavey; 1 road line, 125 feet long; 1 road line, 50 feet long; 10 gallons skid oil; 1 1/2 gallon cylinder oil; 10 lb Frazier's axle grease; 1 pair spreaders; 4 single trees with clips; 1 sled-baker wagon with top box and seat, neck yoke, double trees and single trees; 9 pair coupling dogs; 4 pair single dogs with chains; 1 bar 1 1/2 inch steel, 8 feet long, round; 1 bar 1 1/4 inch iron 7 feet long; 2 set logging harness rope tugs; 1 set wagon harness; 4 head stalls; 1 team of horses bays "Dick" weighing about 1450 lbs, blind in one eye, two white hind feet, scar on right hip - "Charley" weighing about 1400 lbs, one white hind foot, brand indistinct; 1 team of horses, black and bay, "Grant" light bay weighing about 1280 lbs white stripe on forehead - "Barney" black weighing about 1250 lbs.
