

Notice of Location of the Ellen Wood Mine by J. T. Maxon

Notice of Location.

To whom it may concern. Notice is hereby given that J. T. Maxon a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 13 day of Sept. AD 1896 locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz Claim known as the Ellen Wood Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the 29 day of Aug. 1896, and do claim (Eighteen hundred linear feet on the lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dip, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) (Twenty acres of mining ground) situated in Copper Creek district, County of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Located on Copper Creek about one mile from the mouth where it empties in Canyon Creek there is one fir tree on the south bank of said Copper Creek about 20 feet east of the center of this claim or ledge there is one log cabin on this location about 200 feet in a southerly direction from the discovery point of this ledge this ledge runs 500 feet S W and 200 feet back way from center. and I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
