Notice of Location of Lumpy Blaine

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 17th day of September 1896, discovered a vein or lode of Lumpy or hard rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Iron within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 17th day of September 1896, under and in accordance with the Revised Statute of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bull Mountain Mining District County of Seaman and State of Washington and known as the Three Brothers Mining Claim and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from the notice at the prospect shaft. The exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the center Post and thence running 300 ft South West to South East corner Post. Thence 1500 ft North West to North West corner Post thence North East 600 ft to North East corner Post thence 1500 ft South East to North East corner Post thence South West 300 ft to Place of Beginning and that intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
