Notice is hereby given that F. E. Whitten of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon all the real and personal property of Rudolph Kraft, which is used in the operation of the said Rudolph Kraft's logging business in Skamania County, State of Washington, to the extent of the monies due the claimant herein for work and assistance rendered for said Rudolph Kraft upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: That F. E. Whitten was employed by Rudolph Kraft, that the name of the owner or reputed owner of the hereinafter described property is Rudolph Kraft; that said Rudolph Kraft, agreed to pay the said F. E. Whitten, for such labor and assistance \$1.92 per day; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said F. E. Whitten, who performed labor upon said and assisted in operating said logging business in driving team and assisted in building skid road for the period of 38 $\frac{3}{4}$ days; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered between the 20 day of July, 1901, and the 20 day of September 1901, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 20 day of September, 1901, and ninety days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$74.40; that no part thereof has been paid except \$48.50, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offset, the sum of \$25.90, in which amount claimant claims a lien upon the following described property situated in Skamania County, State of Washington, a certain skid road commencing at or near the Hebron Creek saw mill on the N. 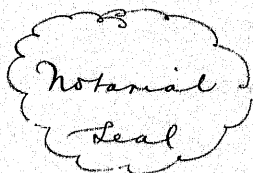
