Notice is hereby given that W. E. Wanker, of Skamania county, state of Washington, claims a lien upon all of the real and personal property of Rudolph Kraft, which is used in the operation of the said Rudolph Kraft's logging business in Skamania county, state of Washington, to the extent of the money due the claimant herein for work and assistance rendered for said Rudolph Kraft upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit: That W. E. Wanker was employed by Geo. Beutton, who was at the time of said employment the agent and manager of said Rudolph Kraft, in the operation of his said logging business in Skamania county, state of Washington; that the name of the owner or reputed owner of the herein after described property is Rudolph Kraft; that said Geo. Beutton, agent and manager for said Rudolph Kraft, agreed to pay the said W. E. Wanker, for such labor and assistance \$2.25 per day; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said W. E. Wanker, who performed labor upon and assisted in operating said logging business as skid road builder, barker, firing donkey, for the period of 87 days; that said labor and assistance was so performed and rendered between the 15th day of June, 1901, and the 29th day of October, 1901, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 29 day of October, 1901, and 40 days have not elapsed since that time, that the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$195.75; that no part thereof has been paid except \$155.85 and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$39.90, in which amount claimant claims a lien upon the following described property situated in Skamania county, state of Washington: A certain skid road commencing at or near the Nelson Creek saw mill on the N. 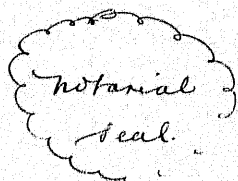
