Whereas, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Stephen P. Adkins has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the north half of the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter, the north half of the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter, and the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section two and the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter and the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section three in Township four north of Range nine east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing seventy acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General:
