Notice is hereby given that John Bevans, of Skamania county, state of Washington, claims a lien upon all of the real and personal property of Randolph Kraft, which is used in the operation of the said Randolph Kraft's logging business in Skamania county, state of Washington, to the extent of the moneys due the claimant herein for work and assistance rendered for said Randolph Kraft, upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: That John Bevans was employed by Randolph Kraft, that the name of the owner or reputed owner of the hereinbefore described property is Randolph Kraft; that said Randolph Kraft agreed to pay the said John Bevans, for such labor and assistance \$2.25 per day; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said John Bevans, who performed labor upon and assisted in operating said logging business, rustling rigging for donkey, digging up logs, for the period of 42 days; that said labor and assistance was so performed and rendered between the 22 day of August, 1901, and the 22 day of November, 1901, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 22 day of November, 1901, and 90 days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimants' demand for said services is \$94.50; that no part thereof has been paid except \$64.56, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$39.94, in which amount claimant claims a lien upon the following described property situated in Skamania county, state of Washington: A certain skid road commencing at or near the Nelson Creek saw mill on the N.W. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 25, Tp. 3 N.R. 7 1/2 E.
