Notice is hereby given that Ira South, of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon all of the real and personal property of Rudolph Kraft, which is used in the operation of the said Rudolph Kraft's logging business in Skamania County, State of Washington, to the extent of moneys due the claimant therein for work and assistance rendered for said Rudolph Kraft upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit: That Ira South was employed by Rudolph Kraft; that the name of the owner or reputed owner of the hereinafter described property is Rudolph Kraft; that said Rudolph Kraft, agreed to pay the said Ira South for such labor and assistance \$2.50 per day; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said Ira South who performed labor upon said and assisted in operating said logging business in running donkey engine and fixing donkey engine for the period of $77\frac{1}{2}$ days; that said labor and assistance was so performed and rendered between the 1 day of July, 1901, and the 16 day of November, 1901, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 16 day of November, 1901, and 90 days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$193.75 that no part thereof has been paid except \$52.50, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$41.15, on which amount claimant claims a lien upon the following described property situated in Skamania County, State of Washington: A certain skid road commencing at or near the Nelson Creek saw mill on the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 25 T. 3 N. R. 7 E. T. 7 N.; 1 donkey engine, Reyer's manufacture, 7 x 8 cylinder; 1 Sedgewood logging donkey engine; 600 feet of $\frac{1}{4}$ inch cable; 1900 feet of $\frac{1}{2}$ inch trip line; 2 pair logging grabs, A. Tourquest make; 4 pair donkey dogs; 2 trip line blocks, A. Tourquest make; 1 head block, A. Tourquest make; 1 lead block, A. Tourquest make; 1 yarding block, A. Tourquest make; 1 yarder with hook and eye, 125 feet long; 1 yarder without hook and eye, 125 feet long; 1 yarder with hook and eye, 50 feet long; 8 chopping axes with handles; a falling axes with handles;

4 sleds with handles; 8 wedges, falling and bucking mixed; 3 Atkins cross cut saws, $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet long; 1 luminous lifeboat falling saw, 7 feet 8 inches long; 2 claw hammers; 1 machine hammer; 1 monkey wrench; 1 pipe wrench; 1 marlin spike; 1 blue cleaver; 3 coal chisels; 3 steel punches; 2 block loops; 2 block straps; 500 feet signal line; 5 saw handles; 2 shovels; 3 picks; 2 grubbing hoes; 1 scale rule; 6 pegs; 1 road line; 125 feet long; 1 road line 50 feet long; 10 gals skid oil; $1\frac{1}{2}$ gals cylinder oil; 10 lbs Trager's axle grease; 1 pair spreader; 4 single trees with clips; 1 Shudbaker wagon with top bar and seat, neck yoke, double trees and single trees; 9 pair compelling dogs; 4 pair single dogs with chains; 1 bar $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch steel, 8 feet long, round; 1 bar $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch iron, 7 feet long; 2 set logging harness rope hags; 1 set wagon harness; 4 head stalls; 1 team of horses bay, "Dick" weighing about 1450 lbs., blind in one eye, two white hind feet, scar on right hip — "Charley" weighing about 1400 lbs, one white hind foot, brand indistinct; 1 team of horses black and bay, "Grant" light bay, weighing about 1280 lbs, white stripe on forehead, — "Barney," black, weighing about 1250 lbs.

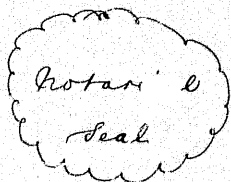
