

Notice of Location of "King of the Forest" by Robertson & Bennett
 To Subvert it every concern: Notice is hereby given, That
 William O. Robertson and Myles M. Bennett a citizen of the United
 States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied
 with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Fifty-two of the Revised
 Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof,
 and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules
 and regulations of miners, did, on the Twenty-Ninth day of October
 AD 1896, locate, and by this Notice do hereby locate a Twenty Claim
 known as the King of the Forest Lode or mining Claim, said
 claim having been discovered the Twenty-Sixth day of October 1896
 and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on the head lode or vein
 bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the
 same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof,
 together with all dip spurs and angles and all other veins
 of lode, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries)
 (twenty acres) situated in Mt. Lookout Mining Dist. County
 of Skamania State of Washington, said location being descri-
 bed and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects
 or permanent monuments, and more particularly described
 as follows, to-wit: From this Post and Notice and
 Center of Discovery shaft running in a South West by dis-
 section (500) fifteen hundred feet and (175) one hundred &
 seventy five feet extra to make linear feet to end Center Post, then
 from Center Post of Notice again running in a North West by
 direction (300) three hundred feet and (40) forty feet extra to make
 linear feet to North West Corner Post, thence South West by
 (1000) fifteen hundred feet and (150) one hundred and fifty
 feet extra to make linear feet to South West Corner Post, thence
 South East by (300) three hundred feet and (40) forty feet extra
 to make linear feet to End Center Post, thence South East by
 again (300) three hundred feet and (50) fifty feet extra to
 make linear feet to South East Corner Post, thence North East by
 (500) fifteen hundred feet and (150) one hundred & fifty feet extra
 to make linear feet to North East corner post, thence North West by
 (300) three hundred feet and (45) forty five feet extra to make linear
 feet to Center Post of Notice and place of beginning, the above claim
 adjoins the North side of the North Shipton Mine. And we intend
 to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local custom
 and rules of miners and the Mining Laws of the United States
