

Notice of Location of "Paster" Mine, by J. T. Maxon
 To whom it may concern, That J. T. Maxon
 a citizen of the United States of America, over the age
 of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements
 of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of
 the United States and of all other mining laws thereof,
 and of the State of Washington and the local customs,
 laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the Six-
 teenth day of October A.D. 1896, locate, and by this notice
 do hereby locate a lode claim, known as the Paster Lode
 or Mining claim, said claim having been discovered
 the Twenty eight day of September 1896, and do claim
 (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lode, lode or vein bearing
 mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same
 being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof,
 together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other
 veins or lodes, the top is open of which he encloses said down-
 dows) (twenty acres of placer mining ground), situated
 in Copper creek Dist. County of Skamania State of Washing-
 ton, said location being described and distinctly marked
 by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and
 more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This claim runs North west 1000 feet from center stake
 on a tributary to copper creek and 300 feet Northeast or
 up the creek and 300 feet Southwest or down the creek. This
 center is about 600 feet up said creek from where it
 empties into copper creek the notice is on a hemlock tree
 this is an old abandoned claim

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance
 with the local customs and rules of miners and the
 mining laws of the United States and of the State of
