

Notice of Location Little Ella. by W. E. Satterfield

To whom it may concern, Notice is hereby given that I W. E. Satterfield a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirtieth of the Revised Statute of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Wash. and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 27th day of Oct-1896, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Lode claim, known as the Little Ella Lode or Mining Claim said claim having been discovered the 27th day of Oct-1896 and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on the lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) (Twenty acres of mining ground) situated in Copper Creek Dist. County of Skamania State of Washington said location being distinctly marked and described by reference to Natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This claim is on the copper creek about five hundred feet above the creek that empties in Copper Creek on the East side this is the first Creek on the East side of Copper Creek above the Big Elephant and about 60 feet above a small spring brook that empties into Copper Creek the claim runs 1000 feet S by 10 degrees E and 200 feet each way from center from this notice

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the Mining Laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
