

Location of the "Samsom" Mine

Notice of Location

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statute of the United States and the local customs laws and regulations has located fifteen hundred linear feet on the Samsom Lode as an extension claim in St. Helens Mining District supposed to be in Lewis County State of Washington and described as follows:—

Beginning at the north east corner of Mrs Mary E O'Connor's Lode Claim on the Samsom Lode and running thence S 55° E fifteen hundred feet S 35° W six hundred feet N 55° W fifteen hundred feet N 35° E six hundred feet to point of beginning

The point of discovery of this claim is in the Samsom Gulch (swept by snow slide) about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile north to northwest from a beaver swamp on the north side of the north fork of Tuttle or Green River near its headwater on the south slope of Goat Mountain and about six miles west of where the Cispus trail crosses the same mountain in St. Helens Mining District supposed to be in Lewis County State of Washington
