

Hundred, and Eight Dollars, executed about May A.D. 1870, and One, and Second-Note for the sum of (\$210) Two Hundred, and Ten dollars, executed of even date, herewith, and Ten dollars of interest accruing on first-Note, and all to be paid in gold or silver coin, all to be paid within Six Months, from the date hereof.

Now if, and provided the said Two Notes shall be paid, on or before the expiration of Six Months, from the date hereof, according to the exigencies thereof, then these presents shall be null and void, and the effects thereof cease, but if default be made, in said payments, or any part thereof, these presents shall be and remain in full force, and be valid in law and in equity.
