Notice is hereby given that James Brown, of Steunem, Klickitat county, state of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of fir saw logs, being about 50,000 feet in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania county, state of Washington, said saw logs being unmarked, and are now lying in the woods in Sec. 21, Tp. 3 N. R. 10 E. of T. 8 N., and in a boom in the Columbia river at the mouth of Columbia cove in Sec. 21, Tp. 3 N. R. 10 E. of T. 8 N. in Skamania county, Washington, for labor performed and assistance rendered in manufacturing said saw logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is George H. Nicolai; that D. D. McDwyre who is a contractor for George H. Nicolai, employed said James Brown to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit:-

The said D. D. McDwyre agreed to pay the said James Brown for said labor and assistance \$2.00 per day; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said James Brown, who performed labor upon and assisted in building a dwelling house, repairing bunk house, cook house and barn for the period of 118 days; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said saw logs between the 20th day of June, 1901, and the 17th day of December, 1901, and the rendition of said service was closed on the 17th day of December, 1901, and 30 days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$236.00; that no part thereof has been paid except \$75.84, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$161.88, in which amount he claims a lien upon said saw logs.


