(3) Thirteen Township (4) Four North Range (10) Ten East, Willamette Meridian, that said D. D. McIntyre thereby became indebted to the said James Brown in the sum of \$265.00; that no part thereof has been paid except \$100.00, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon the sum of \$165.00 in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs.

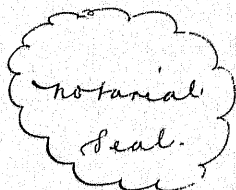
