Notice is hereby given that W. T. Andrews of Skamania County, State of Washington claims a lien upon a lot of logs being about 55000 feet in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington are marked thus S-K and are now lying in Hind River in Skamania County, State of Washington, from the mouth of said River to a point about 8 miles up the stream, for labor performed and assistance rendered in landing hook, barking said logs and building chute in which to transfer said logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is Charles Wetherell and the Hind River Lumber Company; that John Bardness employed said W. T. Andrews to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:-

The said John Bardness agreed to pay the said W. T. Andrews for such labor and assistance the sum of \$2.25 per day and Board, that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said W. T. Andrews, who performed labor upon and assisted in landing hook and barking said logs and in building chute to transferring said logs for the period of 21 and 1/2 days; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logs between the 22nd day of July 1902 and the 22nd day of August 1902; and the rendition of service was closed on the 22nd day of August 1902 and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimants demand for said service is \$48.37 and board; that no part thereof has been paid except the sum of \$6.00 and Board, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$42.37 in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs.

The said W. T. Andrews also claims a lien on all said logs now owned by said John Bardness, of said County to secure payments for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said logs spars, piles or other timber, lumber or shingles herein described
