

Notice of Location of Greenhorn Mine by Wm F. Berry
To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned citizen of the United States, having complied with all the requirements of Chapter Six (6) of Title thirty-two (32) of the Revised Statute of the United States, and the local mining laws, rules and regulations, has located the Greenhorn mine, a gold bearing quartz ledge, about four miles above the mouth of Canyon Creek on East fork of Lewis river, at the mouth of Slide Creek, in Blaine County, Washington, and described as follows:

Commencing at a post on the South Bank of East fork of Lewis river, on the center of said quartz ledge, running thence east three hundred (300) feet, thence South East fifteen hundred (1500) feet, thence west six hundred (600) feet thence North West fifteen hundred (1500) feet, thence East three hundred feet (300) to place of beginning.
