

# Notice of Location of Greenhorn Mine by Wm Wagon To whom it may concern:

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned citizen of the United States, having complied with all the requirements of Chap Six (6) of Title thirty two (32) of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and the local mining laws, rules, and regulations, has located the Greenhorn mine, a gold bearing quartz ledge, about four miles above the mouth of Canyon creek, on East fork of Lewis river, at the mouth of Slide Creek, in Blaine County, Washington, described as follows: Commencing at a point on the South bank of East fork of Lewis river, on the center of said quartz ledge, running thence East three hundred (300) feet, thence North west fifteen hundred (1500) feet, thence West six hundred (600) feet, thence South East fifteen hundred (1500) feet, thence East three hundred (300) feet to place of beginning.
