

Wallace and Thomas Bally, Claimants vs. Peter Yetlick, Debtor.

Notice is hereby given that we, William Wallace and Thomas Bally, have a Demand and claim against said Peter Yetlick in the sum of Thirty four and $\frac{3}{4}$ Dollars for and on account of cutting and splitting Ninety eight and one half cords of Cordwood four feet in length after deducting all credits and offsets: that said Claimants were employed by said Yetlick to cut and split said cordwood in Shumner County, Washington, as follows: Six cords of said wood at One Dollar and twenty five cents a cord and Ninety-Two and one half $(92\frac{1}{2})$ cords thereof at One Dollar a cord to be paid for such cutting as and such time as said Yetlick got said wood hauled to and on the bank of a small lake near by east and about 80 rods from the dwelling house of said Yetlick in Shumner County, Wash. and about 70 rods north of Aubur Cottage in said County. All of said Cordwood so cut and split by said claimants for said Yetlick is red fir and is rickled, some eight foot high, some six feet high and some four feet high. Claimants commenced cutting and splitting said Cordwood about first of November, 1903 and completed the cutting and splitting thereof on the 9th day of January 1904 and thirty days have not since elapsed. Whereof said Claimants claim a lien on all of the Ninety eight and one half cords red fir Cordwood for the payment of said sum of Thirty four Dollars and 3 cents and for the costs, charges and expenses of preparing filing and recording this claim and lien in the further sum of six Dollars.
