

The Wind River Lumber Co. vs. James Baumgartell.

Claim of Lien for Building Material.

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th day of November, 1903, at the request of James Baumgartell, the Wind River Lumber Company commenced to furnish building material to be used in a home situated upon the following described land:

Beginning at a point Eight-hundred forty-two (842) feet south and Thirty (30) feet east of the Northeast corner of Northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Sec. 29, Township 3, Range 8 east; thence east one hundred (100) feet; thence south thirty (30) degrees west one hundred (100) feet; thence north thirty (30) degrees west one hundred (100) feet to place of beginning, being a triangular piece of land one hundred feet on each side, lying and adjoining on the south a piece of land heretofore conveyed to Adolph by Oetabrook, of which property the owner or reputed owner is unknown to us. The furnishing of this material ceased on the nineteenth day of December 1903. That the said material furnished was of the value of \$154.41, for which material the undersigned claims a lien on the property herein described, for the sum of \$56.87.
