

Location of Tunnel claim

Notice of location

Known all men by these presents, that the undersigned, citizen of the United States have this third day of May 1895 claimed by right of location a tunnel claim for the purpose of developing, discovering and working veins lodes or deposits on the line thereof working the Sanson lode. Said Tunnel claim is situated in St. Helena Mining District supposed to be in Lewis County State of Washington and the location and bounds of said Tunnel are staked out on the surface at the place of commencement and termination thereof as well as along the line thereof. Said claim is more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the tunnel face in the lower part of Sanson gulch (swept by snow slide) about one mile north to north west from a Beaver swamp on the north side of North Fork of Tuttle or Green River near its headwaters on the south slope of Goat Mountain and about six miles west of where the Asopus trail crosses the same mountain in St. Helena Mining District supposed to be in Lewis County State of Washington and running thence (without variation) S 35° W seven hundred fifty feet to a post N 55° W thence thousand feet to a post N 35° E seven hundred fifty feet to a post on center of Tunnel line N 35° E seven hundred fifty feet to a post thence S 55° E three thousand feet to a post and thence S 35° W seven hundred fifty feet to point of beginning.

The center line of said tunnel bears N 55° W from the face thereof for 3000 feet to a post which center line of said tunnel is marked on the ground by stakes at intervals of about 200 feet.

Said Tunnel is to be excavated six feet six inches high and five feet wide.

From the face of tunnel

a dead leaning tree bears N 68° E 500 feet distant a dead snag twisted wood bears S 8° E 130 feet distant.
