Walter M. Curdy and Albert M. Curdy, Claimants

vs.

F. F. Foster and David Barr, Doing business under the name and style of Foster & Barr.
 Notice is hereby given that Walter M. Curdy and Albert M. Curdy of Portland, Oregon, claim a lien upon all the logs and all excelsior wood lying and being in the County of Multnomah, State of Washington and on the immediate north bank of the Columbia River between Butler Landing and Hamilton Creek. Said logs now being where they were felled by the claimants herein. And said wood lying now where it was cut by these claimants. Their lien upon said logs and wood is claimed for work and assistance rendered by claimants in cutting said logs and in cutting and splitting said wood. There being about one hundred and twenty-five thousand feet of logs in above description, and about sixty-five cords of wood. That the name of the owner and the reported owner of above described logs and wood is the said F. F. Foster and David Barr doing business under the firm name of Foster and Barr. That said Barr employed these claimants to cut said logs and wood and render assistance therein for said Foster and Barr, on the following terms and conditions:—
 The said Barr and the said Foster and Barr agreed to pay claimants the sum of \$1.25 per cord for cutting wood and seventy-five cents per thousand for cutting logs for all wood and logs that claimants might cut for them. That under said agreement and in pursuance thereof claimants cut eighty-three thousand feet of logs and sixty and one half cords of wood for said Foster and Barr between or about the 12th day of July 1904 and September 26th 1904, when the last of said logs and wood was cut by claimants for said Foster and Barr, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time. That the amount of claimants demand is one hundred three dollars and thirty-five cents, being a balance due said claimant for said services after deducting all just credits and offsets and being the amount for which claimants give notice of a lien upon said logs and wood. The said claimants also claim a lien on all cordwood stored by said Foster and Barr or either of them individually, there being in all about one hundred and fifty cords stored by said Foster and Barr or by each of them individually and now being and located in said county and State on the north bank of the Columbia River and between Butler Landing and Hamilton Creek, to secure payment for the work and labor aforesaid performed under said contract. One half of said amount for which notice of lien is hereby given belongs to each of above claimants.
