THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, TO all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, F. A. Hyde, being the owner of a tract of land situated and included within the limits of a Public Forest Reservation, known and officially designated as the Sierra Forest Reserve, California, has, under the provisions of the Act Approved June 4, 1897, entitled, "An Act making appropriations for Sundry Civil Expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, and for other purposes," reconveyed and relinquished the said Tract to the United States and has, under the provisions of the said Act, selected in lieu thereof the following described Tract of vacant Public Land now open to settlement, to-wit:

The southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section fourteen in Township seven north of Range six east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing forty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said F. A. Hyde, and to his heirs, the land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said F. A. Hyde, and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

WHEREAS There has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress Approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Carl M. Wills has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the East half of the North west Quarter and the East half of the south west quarter of Section twenty three in Township two north of Range six east of Willamette Meridian in Washington containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor General:

NOW KNOW YE, That thereis, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Carl M. Wills the tract of Land above decribed: To Have and to Hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Carl M. Wills and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights; as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, law, and decisions of courts and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.
