THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, C. W. Clarke, being the owner of a tract of land situated and included within the limits of a Public Forest Reservation, known and officially designated as the Sierra Forest Reserve, California, has, under the provisions of the Act approved June 4, 1897, entitled, "An Act Making appropriations for Sundry Civil Expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, and for other purposes," reconveyed and relinquished the said Tract to the United States and has, under the provisions of the said Act, selected in lieu thereof the following described Tract of vacant Public Land now open to settlement, to wit:

The Lots one, two, three, and four, the south half of the north half, and the south half of Section four in Township seven north of Range six east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing six hundred eighty and eighty-eight hundredths acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, Has Given and Cranted, and by these presents Does Give and Grant, unto the said C. W. Clarke, and to his heirs, the land above described: To Have and To Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said C. W. Clarke, and to his heirs and assign forever. Subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts: and there is reserved from the lands hereby grnated, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Warren G. Harding, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed, Given under my hand, in the District of Columbia, the Nineth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and forty-sixth.
