To all whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Joseph E.C.Durgan of Clark County Washington Territory has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver where it appears that Full Payment has been made by the said Joseph E.C.Durgan to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the public lands," for the North east quarter of the North East quarter of Section Twelve in Township One, North of Range Four East and the East half of the South west quarter of Section Six in Township One North of Range Five East, in the District of lands subject to sale at Vancouver, Washington Territory Containing One Hundred and twenty acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tracts, have been purchased by the said Joseph E.C. Durgan.

Now know ye, That the United, States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, Have Given and Granted, and by these presents Do Give and Grant, unto the said Joseph E.C. Durgan, and to his heirs, the said Tract above described, To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Joseph E.C.Durgan, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant President of the United States Of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
