Slipp Bros. to R. Fordyce
Notice of Lien

Robert Fordyce, Plaintiff

Slipp Brothers Lumber Company.

Notice is hereby given that Robert Fordyce, of White Salmon, County of Klickitat, State of Oregon Washington, claims a lien on a quantity of lumber and ties, lying about four hundred thousand feet in quantity, which was cut and manufactured in Steameria County Washington, and is now lying near the mill of the above named Slipp Brothers Lumber Company Steameria in said County of Steameria, State of Washington and along the flume from said mill to the Columbia River and on the beach of said River at and near the end of said flume, all being within said County of Steameria, and State of Washington, said lien being claimed for labor performed and assistance rendered in connection with the manufacture and preparation of said lumber as said County and State: That the owner of the above named lumber is Slipp Brothers Lumber Company; that they employed said Robert Fordyce to perform such labor and to render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit: That said Slipp Brothers Lumber Co. agreed to pay the said Robert Fordyce for such labor and assistance the sum of four dollars (\$4.00) per day, that the said Robert Fordyce worked in pursuance of the said contract of employment ninety three (93) days and that the said contract has been faithfully performed and complied with on the part of the said Robert Fordyce. That said labor and assistance were performed and rendered between the 11th day of July 1907 and the 29th day of October 1907 and the rendition of the said service was closed on the 29th day of October 1907, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time, that the amount of claimants demand for said service is \$465.00, that no part thereof has been paid except the sum of \$187.24 and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all paid credits and offsets, the sum of \$325.76, in which amount he claims a lien upon the said lumber. The said Robert Fordyce claims a lien on all said lumber and ties now owned by the said Slipp Brothers
