

Agreement on Steep Dam

R. C. Baywood and C. O. Baywood, Plaintiffs

V. W. Stepp and L. Stepp, Defendants under the
Provisions of Stepp Dam, Lumber Co.

It is hereby given that R. C. Baywood and C. O. Baywood, of Wagon
Mts, claim a lien upon a quantity of railroad ties and lumber kept
about 1800 ties and about 60 thousand feet of lumber in quantity, which
were cut and manufactured in Shumway County, Washington and are now
lying at or near the mouth of said Stepp Brothers Lumber Company and
Shumway, in said County of Shumway and in the County of said
company at Shumway, in said County in the Columbia River at end of
plum of said company in Shumway County, Washington for labor
performed upon and for assistance rendered in manufacturing said
ties and lumber. That the names of the owner or reputed owners of said
ties and lumber are W. Stepp and L. Stepp, doing business under the
firm name of Stepp Dam Lumber Co., that said company employed
the said R. C. Baywood and C. O. Baywood to perform such labor and
render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions to-wit:
That said Stepp Brothers Lumber Co. agreed to pay the said R. C. Baywood
and C. O. Baywood the sum of \$2.50 per day, payable to be made
monthly, that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully
complied with on the part of R. C. Baywood and C. O. Baywood who
performed labor upon and assisted in manufacturing said ties and lumber
for a period of 43 days and 3 hours and the number of said services rendered
on the part of the said R. C. Baywood on the 21 day of October 1909 and on
the part of C. O. Baywood on the 17th day of October 1909, and thirty days
have not elapsed since that time, that the amount of claimants demand
for said services is \$115.75 that amount thereof has been paid except
the sum of \$66.14 and there is now due and owing against them
after deducting all joint credits and offsets the sum of \$49.61 which
sum they claim a lien upon said ties and lumber. The said claimants
also claim a lien to all said ties and lumber now owned by said Stepp
Brothers Lumber Co. of said County & secure payment for the work and labor
performed in obtaining and securing and manufacturing the said ties and lumber here
described

Notice is hereby given that on the 10th day of May 1909, J. H. Elmer, Charles Elmer and Joseph Elmer, the claimants named above at the request of E. L. Shepherd, of near Leavenworth, Thurston County, Washington, commenced to perform labor upon and furnished material to be used in and upon the following described land situated in said Thurston County, Washington: The South one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of Northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and the Northwest quarter of the Southeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and lots three (3) and four (4) all in Sec. 29, Twp. 3 North Range 58 East 2d S. W. 11, of which land the owner is a joint owner is the said E. L. Shepherd; said work was begun under a contract to grub the stumps off from said land and otherwise improve the same, and the said claimants did also in addition to and as a part of said contract to grub and improve said land, and at the request of the said owner, perform the labor and furnish the supplies heretofore mentioned additional and in excess; that the furnishing of said supplies and the performance of said labor ceased on the 8th day of November 1909, that said labor was performed under a contract to grub said land at a agreed price of \$50.00 per acre; that said owner was to furnish all materials and supplies for said purpose; that the claimants furnished for said work that was used thereon 4-5 boxes of powder of the value of \$21.50, that the claimants paid in work and services on the stumps pulled to be used on said contract for clearing said land 12 days work of the value of \$2.50 per
