And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

This patent is issued in lieu of patent No. 448533, dated December 12, 1914, which as has been cancelled because of an error in the description.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

"An act granting land to aid in the construction of Railroad and Telegraph line from Lake Superior to Puget's Sound, on the Pacific Coast, by the Northern Route, " and the Joint Resolution of May 31, 1870 (16 Stat., 371) there was granted to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, for the purpose of aiding in the construction of said railroad and telegraph line and branch, to the Pacific Coast, "every alternate section of public land, not mineral, designated by odd numbers, to the amount of twenty alternate sections per mile on each side of said railroad line, as said company may adopt, through the Territories of the United States, and ten alternate sections of land per mile on each side of said railroad whenever it passes through any State, and whenever on the line thereof the United States have full title, not reserved sold, granted, or otherwise appropriated, and free from pre-emption or other claims or fights, at the time the line of said road is definitely fixed, and a plat thereof filed in the office of the Commissioner of the General Land Office", and

WHEREAS, it is further provided in said Act "That the word 'mineral' when it occurs in this Act shall not be held to include iron or coal, and

WHEREAS, official statements from the Secretary of the Interior have been folded in General Land O the/office showing that the Commissioners appointed by the President, under the provisions of the fourth section of this first named act, have reported to him that the said Northern Pacific Railroad and Telegraph Line, and Branch, excepting that portion between Wallula, Washington, and Portland, Oregon declared forfeited by the Act of September 29, 1890, have been constructed and fully completed and equipped in the manner prescribed by the Act relative thereto, and the same accepted by the President; and
