THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,
TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the claimant Louvina Rhodes according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of April, 24, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the Lots five and six of Section thirty in Township seven north of Range five east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing seventy-one acres and twenty-three hundredths of an acre.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General:

NOW, KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT unto the said claimant and to the heirs of said claimant the tract above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States. Reserving unto the United States, its permittee or licensee, the right to enter upon, occupy and use, any part or all of Lot six of said Section thirty for the purposes provided in the Act of June 10, 1920 (41 Stat., 1063) and subject to the conditions and limitations of Section twenty-four of said Act.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

W H E R E A S, a Certificate of the District Land Office at Spokane, Washington is now deposited in the Bureau of Land Management, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by James Borin and Vera M. Borin, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of April 24, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands", and the acts supplemental thereto, for the following described land:

Willamette Meridian, Washington.

T. 2 N., R. 5 E.

Sec. 10, NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$.

The area described contains 40 acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Land on file in the Bureau of Land Management.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said James Borin and Vera M. Borin, and to their heirs, the tract above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said James Borin and Vera M. Borin, and to their heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the land hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

Excepting and reserving however, to the United States, pursuant to the provisions of the Act of August 1, 1946 (60 Stat., 755), all uranium, thorium, or any other material, which is or may be determined to be peculiarly essential to the production of fissionable materials, whether or not of commercial value, together with the right of the United States, through its authorized agents or representatives, at any time, to enter upon the land and prospect for, mine, and remove the same.
