

Notice of Location of Lode Mining Claim (Pole Star)
 The undersigned, who is a Citizen of the United States, hereby declares and gives notice to all persons concerned, that he has discovered a vein or lode within the limits of the claim hereby located, and in said lode a vein of quartz or ore, with at least one well defined wall, and that he has this 10th day of October 1896, located, and do hereby locate and claim, under and by virtue of Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, of the Revised Statute of the United States, and the laws amendatory thereto, and the laws of the State of Washington, a mining claim upon said lode or vein, to be known as the Pole Star, Lode or Mining Claim. Extending along said lode or vein 1000 feet in a North westerly direction from the center of said discovery shaft, at which place a notice of the discovery of this claim is posted, and 200 feet on each side of the middle or center of the discovery on said lode or vein, at the surface; comprising in all 1000 feet in length along said lode or vein, and 200 feet in width, with all the rights and privileges, as to surface ground and lodes, veins and beds, within the boundaries of said claim, and the metals, minerals and valuable deposits of every kind contained in said veins, lodes or beds, or within said boundaries, which are given or allowed by laws of the United States or of the State of Washington. This location is distinctly marked on the ground, so that it can be distinctly traced by a mound of rocks two feet square and three feet high, at the discovery shaft, where the notice is posted, and by a mound of rocks two feet high and one foot square, also a stake square & inches and sticking above the ground two feet, at each of the four corners of the claim. The claim is more particularly described as follows: The discovery shaft is situated about one mile up a small stream, which empties into the Canyon Creek, said unknown stream is about one half mile from the mouth of Silver Star Creek when it empties into the Canyon Creek, said claim is on un-surveyed Government land, in Skamania County, and in the Lewisville Mining district, State of Wash. The undersigned intends to hold this claim under and according to the laws of the United States and the State of Washington
