

Notice of Location of "Little Ada" by John Stickler

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that I, the undersigned citizen of the United States, over the age of 21 years, having complied with all the requirements of Chapter 6, of Title 32, of the revised statutes of the United States and the local mining laws, customs and regulations, have located a quartz claim on this lode or vein, to be known as the "Little Ada" claim, extending for a distance of 1500 linear ft along said lode or vein, situated in the copper creek mining District, Skamania County, State of Washington, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the notice on small bench bet on left bank of left fork of Bowling Creek and extending 600 ft in a direction S. S. E. along the course of the vein; and 700 ft in a direction N. N. W. along the course of the vein; width of 200 ft on each side of the vein. The sides and ends of claim are staked and each corner is marked by a stake. This claim lies at the head of the left fork of Bowling Creek, about 1/2 mile up that stream from the "Baby Alice" claim. The "Little Ada" claim was discovered and a discovery notice placed upon it at a time previous to the discovery of the "Elk Horn" claim which lies N. N. W. of the "Little Ada" and joins it on the North end.
