

Notice of Location of "Cora Bell" by John Stickler

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that I, the undersigned citizen of the United States, over the age of 21 years, having complied with all the requirements of Chapter 16 of Title 2, of the Revised Statute of the United States, and the local mining laws, customs & regulations have located a Quartz claim on this lode or vein to be known as the Cora Bell claim extending for a distance of 1500 linear feet along said lode or vein, situated in the Copper Creek Mining District, Kamama County State of Washington and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the notice, on large fir tree on left bank of stream and running in a direction thirty degrees South of East for 300 ft. to a stake marked S.E. corner of Cora Bell; thence 1000 ft. in a direction 30° East of North to stake marked N.E. corner of Cora Bell; thence 300 ft. in a direction 30° North of West to stake marked N. Center of Cora Bell; containing 300 ft. in same direction to stake marked N.W. corner of Cora Bell; thence 100 ft. in a direction 30° West of South to stake marked S.W. corner of Cora Bell; thence 300 ft. in a direction 30° North of East to place of beginning. This claim is situated at the head of Foreupine Gulch in North of the New Year Lode claim, and is about 1/4 mile north of canon fork. Discovered January 2nd 1897
