H. S. Johnson, Plaintiff

vs.

M. Reynolds

Verdict is hereby given that H. S. Johnson of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien on one cord of cord wood and a lot of maple and alder saw logs and wood being four foot split fir and wood being about twenty one cords in quantity and said maple and alder saw logs being about fourteen hundred in number containing about 20,000 linear feet, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, are unmarked and now lying in said County in piles; and 21 cords of cord wood is located on the west side, edge of the Skamania Portland & Seattle Railway Company at Oakley, Skamania County, State of Washington, about 500 of said maple and alder saw logs are now lying on the bank on the north bank of the Columbia River on William Davis's land about one half mile in a north-westerly direction from the Skamania Portland & Seattle Railway station at Oakley, Skamania County, Washington and the remaining 870 of said logs are now lying in the woods where cut on the land of Mrs. M. Reynolds about one mile northwesterly from said Oakley station, Skamania County, State of Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in and about cutting, sawing and preparing said cordwood and saw logs for market, that the name of the owner or reputed owner of said sawlogs and cord wood is M. Reynolds. That M. Reynolds employed the said H. S. Johnson to perform said labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: That M. Reynolds agreed to pay the said H. S. Johnson for such labor and assistance the sum of \$1.25 per cord for cutting and wood and the sum of nine tenths of one cent per linear foot for cutting and preparing for market the said logs; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said H. S. Johnson, who performed labor upon and assisted in and about cutting and preparing said cord wood and sawlogs for market for the period of about 3½ months; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said wood and logs between the 1st day of May 1911 and the 16th day of September 1911 and the rendition of said service was closed on the 15th day of September 1911, and thirty days have now elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$128.75, that no part thereof has been paid, except \$59.50 and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and offsets the sum of \$69.25 in which amount he claims a lien upon said cord wood and sawlogs. The said H. S. Johnson also claims a lien on all said cordwood and sawlogs and cordwood now owned by said M. Reynolds of said county to secure the payment for the work and labor performed
