

Notice of Location of yellow Hammer by B Bruner

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given, That I, B Bruner a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty two of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and of all other mining laws thereof, and the State of Washington, and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 17 day of Sep^r AD 1896, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a quartz placer claim, known as the yellow Hammer Lode or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 17 day of September 1896, and do claim (fifteen hundred acres feet on this lead, lode or vein, bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center line of, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lies within said boundaries) situated in copper creek mining District-County of Skamania State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the North center end stake of what is known as the yellow Bird claim and running 1500 acres ft. about ten ten degrees west of north to the other center stake, and running 300 ft on each side of center line Thus taking the amount of ground allowed as a lawful quartz or mining claim.
