Notice is hereby given that Ben Miller of Skamania County, State of Washington
claims a lien on account of cord wood and a lot of maple and alder saw logs
and wood bark for work done for cord wood bark about twenty one cords
in quantity and said maple and alder saw logs bark about fourteen hundred
in amount containing about 20000 linear feet, which were cut or manufactured
in Skamania County State of Washington, and were and are now lying in
said County as follows: said 21 cords of cord wood is stacked on the right
of the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway Company on the west side of
the station of said Railway company at DuPont, Skamania County State of Washington
about 500 of said maple and alder sawlogs are now lying on the bank on
the north bank of the Columbia River on William Quinn's land about one half
mile in a southwesterly direction from the Spokane, Portland and Seattle
railway station at DuPont, Skamania County, Washington, and the remaining
870 of said logs are now lying in the woods where and on the land of Mrs
M. Reynolds about one mile northerly from said DuPont Station, Skamania County
State of Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in
and about cutting, moving and preparing said cord wood and saw logs for
market; that the name of the owner or reputed owner of said sawlogs
and cord wood is M. Reynolds; that said M. Reynolds, employed the said
Ben Miller to perform said labor and render such assistance upon the following
terms and conditions, to-wit:

The said Mr. Reynolds agreed to pay the said Ben Miller for said labor and materials the sum of ^{one hundred and twenty five} \$125.00 for cutting and work and the sum of ^{one hundred and twenty five} \$125.00 for hauling and work for cutting and preparing for market the said cordwood; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Ben Miller, who performed labor upon and received in and about cutting and preparing said cordwood and saw logs for market for the period of about 2½ months, that said labor and materials were so performed and rendered upon said cordwood and logs between the 25th day of June 1911 and the 16th day of September 1911 and the initiation of said service was closed on the 15th day of September 1911, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time, that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$100.25, that as much thereof has been paid except \$55.35 and that there is now due and necessarily unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and offsets the sum of \$44.90 in which amount he claims a lien upon said cordwood and saw logs. The said Ben Miller also claims a lien on all said cordwood and saw logs and cordwood now owned by said Mr. Reynolds of said county to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said cordwood and saw logs herein described.
