

Notice of Location of Ogark Lode by J. M. Mickey
 To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby
 given, That J. M. Mickey a citizen of the United States of
 America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with
 the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirtieth of the Revised
 Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws
 thereof and of the State of Washington and the local customs,
 laws, rules and regulations of mine, did, on the thirty first
 day of December A.D. 1896, locate, and by this notice do hereby
 locate a Lode Claim known as the Ogark Lode or Mining Claim,
 said claim having been discovered the fifteenth day of June
 1896, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this end, lode,
 or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width,
 the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof,
 together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or
 lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries)
 (Twenty acres) situated in Canyon Creek mining district, County
 of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and
 distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or prominent mon-
 uments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a point 10° N.E. from Silver Star rock on the summit
 of Silver Star mt and N from the first mt peak east from
 Silver Star mt running 300 ft. 55° S.W. to a fir stake 70° S.E. 3 ft.
 from a fir tree 4 in diameter. 70° S.W. 22 ft from a fir tree 3 1/2 ft.
 in diameter. Running 1500 ft. 35° S.E. to a fir stake 50° S.W. 2 ft from
 a fir tree 2 1/2 in diameter 60° N.E. 16 ft from a fir tree 2 1/2 ft. in
 diameter. Running 600 ft. 55° N.E. to a fir stake, S.E. 25° 36 ft from
 a fir tree 4 ft. in diameter. S. 24 from a hemlock tree 1 ft in
 diameter. Running 1500 ft. 55° N.W. to a fir stake, 50° S.W. 16 ft
 from a larch tree 2 1/2 ft in diameter 60° N.E. 18 ft from a fir tree
 2 1/2 ft in diameter. Running 300 ft. 55° S.W. to a fir stake the
 point of beginning. And I intend to hold and work said claim
 in accordance with the local customs and rules of mine and
 the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
