Timberman's Lien on Wood.

L. N. Inman, claimant
vs.

R. J. Vandenberg, Owner.

Notice is hereby given that L. N. Inman of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of four foot fir cordwood, being about 175 cords in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, are unmarked except the same is ordinary 4 foot split fir cordwood, which said cordwood is now lying in the vicinity of Wood Station on the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway, in the eastern part of said

Spokane, about 75 cords thereof being in the woods on the land owned, or reputed to be owned, by the above named R. J. Vandenberg, and the balance in the switch yards of said Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway at said Hood station, and at the boat landing at said Hood station, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in hauling and securing said wood for market; that the name of the owner, or reputed owner is R. J. Vandenberg; that R. J. Vandenberg employed said C. N. Iman to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: the said R. J. Vandenberg agreed to pay the said C. N. Iman for such labor and assistance the sum of \$1.40 per cord for hauling said wood, and the said C. N. Iman, under said agreement has hauled 455 cords of wood which at said agreed price amounted to \$637.40; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said C. N. Iman, who performed labor upon and assisted in hauling said wood for the period of four months and six days; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said cordwood between the 10th day of May, and the 17th day of September, 1912, and was closed on the 17th day of September, 1912, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$637.40; that no part thereof has been paid except the sum of \$428.50 and there is now due and unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$208.90, in which amount he claims a lien upon said cordwood. The said C. N. Iman also claims a lien on all said cordwood now owned by said R. J. Vandenberg of said county to secure the payment for the work of hauling said cordwood herein described.
