 To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given  
 that the undersigned citizen of the United States, having complied  
 with all the requirements of Chapter 6 of Title 52 of the Revised  
 Statutes of the United States, and the local mining laws, rules and  
 regulations, has located 1500 ft lode on Good Hope lode  
 situated in Romania Co, Wash and bounded as follows.
