Notice of is hereby given that the undersigned having complied with the requirements of chapter Six of Title Thirty Two of the Revised Statute of the United State and the local customs, laws and regulations, has located fifteen hundred linear feet on the Samson lode in St. Helens mining district supposed to be in Lewis County State of Washington and described as follows:

Beginning at point of discovery of the claim in the Samson gulch, swept by snow slide which point is at the entrance of the Samson tunnel claim above a barren lode on the North Fork of Tutter or Green River and about two miles westerly from where the Cispus trail crosses Quartz Creek and running thence (without variation) N 35° E 300 feet thence N 55° W 1500 feet thence S 35° W 300 feet to center of lode S 35° W 300 feet S 55° E 1500 feet N 35° E 300 feet to point of beginning
