

Notice of location of the Kingbird Quartz claim by Charles W. Bigham
To whom it may concern.

Notice is hereby given that I Charles W. Bigham a citizen of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years, having complied with the requirements of chapter six of title thirty two of the revised statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the state of Washington and the local customs laws rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 4 day of October A.D. 1896 locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz claim known as the Kingbird lode or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 4 day of October 1896 and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie in said boundaries) (twenty acres of mining ground) situated in the Copper Creek Dist. County of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows to-wit:

This claim is an extension on the claim known as the Jennie Cramp this notice is on one stake at the north end and runs 1500 feet in a southerly direction to center stake on south end thence 800 feet in westerly direction to corner stake thence 1500 feet in a northerly direction to corner stake thence 800 feet in a easterly direction to center stake at north end thence 800 feet east to corner stake thence 1500 feet in a southerly direction to corner stake thence 800 feet west to center stake on south end of claim. And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the state of Washington.
