

Notice of location of the claim San Jose by Joseph Manning.  
To whom it may concern.

Notice is here by given that Joseph Manning a citizen of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years having complied with the requirements of chapter six of title thirty two of the revised statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof and of the state of Washington and the local customs laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1897, locate, and by this notice hereby locate a quartz claim known as the San Jose lead or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 1897 and do claim fifteen hundred feet on this lead, lode or vein, bearing mineral in place by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries situated in Copper Creek mining district County of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at this stake and notice it runs 1000 feet in a northerly direction to the center end stake thence 300 feet in an easterly direction to the North east corner stake thence 1000 feet in a southerly direction to the southwest corner stake thence 300 feet in a westerly direction along the line of the Santa Clara claim to the center end stake, thence 300 feet in a westerly direction along the line of the Santa Clara claim to the south west corner stake thence 1000 feet in a northerly direction to the north west corner stake thence 300 feet in an easterly direction to the center end stakes. All discovery is at the center end stake and I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the Mining Laws of the United States and of the State of
