

Notice of location of the claim - Lincoln Park by S. F. Murray.
To whom it may concern.

Notice is hereby given that S. F. Murray citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty one years, having complied with the requirements of chapter six of title thirty two of the revised statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws those of and of the state of Washington and of the local customs laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the 20th day of February A.D. 1897, locate and by this notice do hereby locate a quartz claim, known as the Lincoln Park lode or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 1st day of February 1897 and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lode, lode or vein bearing mineral in place by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes the topography of which lie within said boundaries) (situated in Copper Creek mining district of Skamania County State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows to wit:

Beginning at this stake and notice it runs 1500 feet in a north westerly direction to center end stake thence 300 feet in an easterly direction to the north east corner stake thence 1000 feet in a south easterly direction to the south east corner stake thence 300 feet in a westerly direction to the center end stake thence 300 feet in a westerly direction to the southwest corner stake thence 1000 feet in a north westerly direction to the north west corner stake thence 300 feet in an easterly direction to the center end stake.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the state of Washington.
