ister of the land Office at Vancouver whereby it appears that full payment has been
made by the said Hiram A. Leavens according to the Provisions of the act of Congress
of the 24th of April 1820 entitled an act making further provision for the sale
of the public lands for the Lot numbered six of section twenty five in Township
Township two North of Range six East in the district of lands subject to sale at
Vancouver Washington Territory containing six acres according to the Official Plot
of the survey of the said lands returned to the general land office by the surveyor
general which said tract has been purchased by the said Hiram A. Leavens now know
ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in com-
formity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given
and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Hiram A. Leavens
and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and to hold the same together
with all the Rights, Privileges, Immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature
thereunto belonging unto the said Hiram A. Leavens and to his heirs and assigns
forever in testimony whereof I, Andrew Johnson President of the United States of
America have caused these letters to be made patent and the seal of the general
land office to be hereunto affixed given under my hand at the city of Washington the
Second day of July and the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty
six and of the Independence of the United States the Ninetieth.

posited in the general land office of the United States a certificate numbered one
hundred and twenty four of the Register and Receiver at Vancouver Washington Ter-
ritory whereby it appears that under the provisions of the act of congress approved
the 27th day of September 1850 entitled an act to create the office of Surveyor
general of the public Lands in Oregon and to provide for the Survey and to make
donations to Settlers of the said Public Lands and the legislation supplemental
thereto the claim of Elizabeth Snooks of Skamania County, Washington Territory Not-
ification N. 1471 has been established to a donation of one half section or three
hundred and twenty acres of Land and th at the same has been surveyed and designated
as claim number thirty seven being part of section twenty five in township two North
of Range Six East according to the Official Plot of Survey returned to the general
land office by the surveyor general being bounded and described as follows towit.
