

Notice of location of the Quartz claim Bacon by J. P. Weston.
To whom it may concern:

Notice is hereby given that J. P. Weston, citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty one years of age, having complied with the requirements of chapter six of title thirty two, of the revised statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the state of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the twenty fifth day of February ^{A.D.} 1897, locate and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz claim, known as the Bacon Lode or vein of claim, said claim having been discovered the 20 day of February 1893; and do claim fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes the top or apex of which lies within said boundaries, situated in Lewis River district, county of Grays Harbor, State of Washington, said location being ascribed and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows to wit: Beginning at a maple stake on Garlin creek 78 mi. from its junction with Lewis river and running thence 160 ft 80° S.W. to a maple stake thence 1600 feet 80° N.W. to a maple stake on the Southeast line of the Bryne claim thence 330 ft 80° N.E. to a maple stake thence 100 ft 80° E.S. to a maple stake, thence 160 ft 80° S.W. to the point of beginning.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
