

Notice of location of of the Quartz claim Carried by J. K. Manning
To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that J. K. Manning a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty one years, having complied with the requirements of chapter six of title thirty two of the revised statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners did, on the 19th day of February A. D. 1897, locate, and by this notice do, hereby locate a quartz claim known as the Carrie Lode or vein claim, said claim having been discovered the 24th day of January 1897, and do claim fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries. Situated in Copper Creek Mining district County of Okanogan State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows to wit:

Commencing at this stake and notice it runs 1000 feet in a northerly direction from Copper Creek to center end stake thence 300 feet in an easterly direction to the northeast corner stake thence 1000 feet in a southerly direction along the west line of the Yellow Bird claim to the southeast corner stake on Copper Creek thence 660 feet down the stream of Copper Creek to the southwest corner stake thence 1000 feet in a northerly direction to the northwest corner stake thence 800 feet in an easterly direction to the center end stake.

and I intend to work and hold said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the state of Washington.
